The Benefits of CWBA Membership

The Central Washington Beekeepers Association is a non-profit organization established to foster closer relations between area beekeepers, to share ideas and experiences, to improve beekeeping methods, to keep up with current issues affecting honey bees in our area, to educate the general public on “all things honey bee” and to encourage and assist anyone desiring to enter the beekeeping community in doing so. What do you get for your membership fee? LOTS!

1. Membership in a fun community of beeks ranging from novice to well seasoned and from sane to slightly crazy. Information, advice and support on all aspects of beekeeping (Okay, *technically* you can get your questions answered at the free attendance monthly meetings)

3. Access to Field Days (demonstrations such as Splitting a Hive, How to Install a Nuc, Monitoring for Mites)

6. 15% discount off *American Bee Journal* subscriptions, must submit your subscription using a special form that you can get from the CWBA Secretary. (Unfortunately, just FYI, *Bee Culture* discontinued their discount program a few years ago; instead, they “...lowered the overall price of a subscription & every subscriber gets a free calendar in their January issue”.)
7. Association membership in the Washington State Beekeepers Association
8. (optional) Listing in an annual membership directory to support communication among club beekeepers
9. (optional) Listing on a swarm call list as a service to the public. Must attend swarm collection training.
